

## **STUDY TRIP - INFO**

Date: 29.08 - 14.09.2014

**Participants:** up to 20 people aged 18-28

Route: Gdańsk, Warsaw, Budapest, Timisoara, Sopron, Bratislava, Prague and Berlin

**Project objectives**: to enable a group of young people to be confronted with the "living history" of 1989 - the places and actors of the democratic changes in Central and Eastern Europe. Participants will **document the trip on a shared blog in the form they choose** (essays, commentaries, photos, videos, drawings or audio recordings).

**Costs:** the organisers will cover the costs of food, accommodation and transport during the trip, as well as the transport to Gdańsk and from Berlin. Participants will be asked to purchase accident and liability insurance at their own cost for the duration of the trip.

## INTERNATIONAL RECRUITMENT OF PARTICIPANTS

The task of the candidates is to present a personal interpretation of the events of the Autumn of Nations and their consequences for contemporary Europe.

The applications should be submitted online with the use of an electronic form available on the website of Freedom Express <a href="www.freedomexpress.enrs.eu">www.freedomexpress.enrs.eu</a> no later than on the **30<sup>th</sup> of June 2014**.

The participants of the study trip will be chosen on the basis of the following criteria:

- (1) A creative interpretation of the topic: "The traces of '89 today people, places and events". "Trace" can be understood as a place, a person encountered, memories of the time etc. The works can take any creative form of expression, including fields such as literature, journalism, visual arts, music, science, film and photography. The submitted works should meet the following requirements:
  - ✓ written work in English: pdf format, up to 9,000 characters with spaces
  - ✓ artwork: scan of a drawing, photograph of an object
  - ✓ audio, audiovisual work: up to 2 minutes
- (2) Short justification letter of up to 700 characters: Why you would like to take part in the Freedom Express trip?

## STUDY PROGRAMME FOR PARTICIPANTS

A study programme will be organised by partner institutions in each of the countries on the route. The Programme will include meetings with witnesses of history, visits to museums and places of historical significance, as well as lectures and debates.

Before the trip begins, the participants will take part in **a workshop in Gdańsk**, where group members will get to know each other. The workshop programme will also enable participants to become familiar with the historical context of the venture, as well as the coverage techniques, which they will use during the trip. All of the works and the journey itself will be recorded in a documentary presenting the confrontation of a young generation with the traces of breakthrough in Central and Eastern Europe.

Two moderators will accompany the group throughout the trip:

- ✓ a historian, who will support participants in content-related matters and introduce them to the historical context of events;
- ✓ a documentarian, who will teach them how to create coverage, i.e. how to choose topics and characters and how to document them.
