Management of Research Projects and Research Teams

When: 2 September 2009, 9-18h

Where: Alter Musiksaal (Mainz University, Forum universitatis 1, Becher-Weg 2, 2nd floor)

Contents

- General introduction to project management: What is a project? What does project management mean? What are the tasks of a project leader, etc.
- Project preparation and initiation: defining goals, developing planning phases, proposal, milestones, kick-off
- Realization: styles of leadership, team development, team work
- Supervision of project work
- Project checkup: compliance with project requirements, strategies of modification
- Project close-out: achievement of objectives, finish

Target audience: (Foreign) Doctoral students working in research teams or in charge of coordinating projects.

Writing good scientific papers

Doing research is just one important part of a doctoral candidate's work. The other important part consists of presenting the results to the scientific community by publishing papers in journals. Often the writing process turns out to be a quite difficult task. Therefore, this workshop will give assistance to doctoral candidates who already are or will soon be facing the challenge of writing a scientific paper. This workshop therefore aims at improving the writing skills of the participants.

When: 8 October 2009 (9.30-16.30h); 9 October 2009 (9-15h)

Where: Room 04-432, SB II (Mainz University, Colonel-Kleinmann-Weg 2, 4th floor)

Contents

The workshop consists of two parts. First PD Dr. W. Schärtl will present and discuss the principles of writing good scientific papers. Then the participants will themselves start writing a paper in small groups. The problems that may arise throughout the writing process as well as the outcome will be presented by each group, and commented by the course instructor.

(Foreign) doctoral candidates of Mainz University doing research in subjects belonging to: chemistry, physics, biology, geology, or medicine (lab workers). The participants should have at least one year research experience. The course is not meant for persons who are nearly finished.
