Main contents

The BIP “**Migrants and Cities: Intersectional Studies on the Mutual Interaction Between New Citizens and Urban Space**” proposes an **intensive training course** on how urban space is spatially connotated by the presence of migrants, especially in the peripheral areas of cities and historical centres, and at the same time how the city influences migrants' lives, determining the conditions of quality or denial of quality.

The BIP aims to examine the interaction between migrants and the urban spaces in which they are settled, focusing both on their influence in the transformation processes of urban environments and on the ways in which cities influence migrants' quality of life and integration. The main objective is **to understand the multidimensional dynamics of this process and to develop concrete strategies to promote coexistence and integration**.

The **approach to the proposed topic is interdisciplinary** in that it brings together different research profiles, ranging from pedagogists, communication experts, urban planners, sociologists, cultural studies experts, philosophers and psychologists, geographers and anthropologists, and lawyers.

The programme is deeply rooted within the objectives and actions of the **Diversity and Migration Lab of the Forthem Alliance**, configuring itself as an operational and implementation tool with respect to the Lab's objectives.

The course programme is developed according to a dual modality: **a live training (in presence) in Palermo (10 June - 14 June 2024) and a virtual training (24 June - 28 June 2024)**.

The programme, which provides for the recognition of 3CFU, has a significant applied laboratory component that will allow lecturers and students to experiment together with cooperative techniques and applied research activities.


