Why ROSE - Analysis



Striking GAP between

- a) the **importance of societal issues for Europe** and the aims
- the European Commission has recently defined for its future
 - ✓ Social Europe
 - ✓ creating more unity within our societies
 - ✓ Harmonizing social security rights

and

b) surprising **low budget for research on societal issues** very **limited number of projects financed**, high complains of the Commission about the **lack of impact**.

ROSE Action I: towards Researchers



How to foster a mentality of impact generation from scientific results in Research on Societies?

- Pureness of Science vs. pragmatic vision of science that includes communication for general public and impact
- Encourage involvement of stakeholders in projects
- Encourage diversified instruments for publication of results
- Training simplification without loosing scientific rigor
- Follow the work of projects such as Dandelion/COURAGE and be inspired by their recommendations

Contact stakeholders (Commission, ministeries, NCPs, KoWi, policy oriented consortia, communities, networks and alliances etc..)

- State importance of Research on Societies and point to contradictions (Europe without research on itself?)
- Redefine Impact/Missions in order to include Research on Societies
- Propose **topic ideas** (that cannot be refused)
- Claim for more budget more project (in order to enhance impact)

	writing down a 5-pages manifesto	Effective communication > distille small, clear messages
Dec	Second Meeting – fixing content of paper "missions" (2-3 pages)	Be open and flexible > use options for presentation and publicity
Jan	Recommendation paper finalized (1 page)	> react and contribute to current issues
Feb	publication of recommendation	Representation of the group > contact - spokesperson > name
	Future: Scientist – Stakeholder meeting	> webpage> ongoing communication
	Jan	 "missions" (2-3 pages) Jan Recommendation paper finalized (1 page) Feb publication of recommendation
